





# CONGREGANT CARDS OF ADMISSION



In order to receive High Holy Days Cards of Admission, each congregant household must be in good standing with the Temple. A congregant household in good standing has paid, in full, a minimum of 50% of their 2024-2025 dues, assessments, and school tuition, or has scheduled monthly, quarterly or bi-annual payments, and made the first payment, through ShulCloud or with our Executive Director, Jan Kaufman.

- Pillar memberships include eight (8) Cards of Admission
- Patron memberships include four (6) Cards of Admission
- Sustaining memberships include four (4) adult Cards of Admission and additional Cards of Admission for children through the age of 26.
- Family memberships include two (2) adult Cards of Admission and additional Cards of Admission for children through the age of 26.
- Individual memberships include one (1) adult Card of Admission and additional Cards of Admission for children through the age of 26.
- Associate and Out-of-State members are encouraged to purchase
   Cards of Admission for a required contribution of \$180 per person for
   attendance at either Rosh HaShanah or Yom Kippur services or \$300
   per person for attendance at both Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur.

# How Will I Receive My Cards of Admission?

This year Cards of Admission will be mailed to those requesting them. ONE adult Card of Admission per person will be provided to each adult household member and will be used for admittance to ALL High Holy Days services. Please remember to bring them with you for each service you plan to attend. Security will not allow admittance to the building without a Card of Admission

In order ensure appropriate capacity limits, congregants are encouraged to request Cards of Admission for specific services they plan to attend. Cards of Admission will be provided on a first-come, first served basis. Cards of Admission are non-transferrable.

Family and Tot service Cards of Admission will be provided to each adult family member requesting them. We will NOT issue Cards of Admission to children under the age of 18. Please remember to bring them with you for each service you plan to attend. Security will not allow admittance to the building without a Card of Admission.

Service selections must be made, and received, by the Temple no later than **September 16**, at which time the requests will be opened for community members for purchase.

## Welcoming Guests and Guest Cards of Admission for Purchase

Sinai congregants in good standing may request Guest Cards of Admission for \$180 per guest for attendance at **either** Rosh HaShanah or Yom Kippur services **or** \$300 per guest for attendance at **both** Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur services. Cards of Admission are intended to be used for non-affiliated immediate family members including parents, grandparents, adult children and their spouses. Upon request, Cards of Admission are also available for caregivers **at no cost**.

Guest Cards of Admission will be provided for the chosen service times of the household requesting them. Due to capacity limits, congregants may request **up to two additional Guest Cards of Admission**. Names and contact information for each guest is required to be completed on the registration form.

ONE Guest Card of Admission per person will be provided to each member guest and will be used for access to ALL High Holy Days Services. Please remind your guest(s) to bring them for each service they plan to attend. Security will not allow admittance to the building without a Card of Admission.

## Reciprocity

Chicago Sinai welcomes congregants from other URJ congregations within the Reform Movement. Submission of the reciprocal congregant agreement is required, and is subject to available capacity.

### **Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur**



We encourage members of our wider community, who wish to join us for in-person High Holy Days services, to contact the Temple office at 312.867.7000 **after September 16**. Based on available capacity, we are pleased to offer Cards of Admission for purchase for a required contribution of \$200 per person for attendance at **either** Rosh HaShanah or Yom Kippur services or \$360 per person for attendance at **both** Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur.

Community Cards of Admission contributions for High Holy Days may be applied toward Sinai membership dues up to January 1, 2025. Please contact our Executive Director, Jan Kaufman at jkaufman@chicagosinai.org to discuss membership opportunities.

# IMPORTANT INFORMATION



## **Streaming**

Sinai High Holy Days Services will be able to be viewed on our website on the Watch Live page under Worship. All services will be live streamed, except for Tot Services.

## **Accessible Seating**

Designated accessible seating will be available at all services for those congregants who require assistance. Seating must be requested in advance through your High Holy Days registration form or by contacting Gianna DeMase at gdemase@chicagosinai.org or 312.867.7000. Please note that we will limit reserved seating to a maximum of four (4) seats.

### **Audio and Visual Aids**

Hearing amplification devices are available at all services in the Sanctuary. Large print prayer books are available at our Adult Services and will be located on the book racks outside the Sanctuary. Please contact a Greeter or Sinai staff member for assistance.

## Security

As always, we are taking every step necessary to ensure the safety and security of our community. Please give yourself adequate time to enter our building. Security personnel will be checking Cards of Admission at the door. Access to our building will not be permitted without a Card of Admission. Having them readily available when you arrive will be appreciated.

Please also limit what you bring with you to services. Chicago Sinai security personnel may conduct searches of anyone entering the building. Security will conduct searches of briefcases, backpacks and oversized bags, and members will be asked to store these items in the first-floor coat room. Electric scooters and bicycles will not be permitted in the building.



# How to Login to your ShulCloud account

- 1. Visit the website chicagosinaicongregation.shulcloud.com
- 2. In the top right corner of the page, you will see the word "Login". Click "Login"
- 3. Type in your email address and password associated with your account.
- 4. Once you are logged in, you will see the words "High Holy Days 2024". Located here are all High Holy Days forms.

As a volunteer, you will be assigned delivery to 2-3 families in nearby Chicago communities (including Lake View, Near North, Lincoln Park, DePaul, Wrigleyville, North Halsted, West Loop, and West Town). Box pickup will be on Sunday, **September 29** at Chicago Sinai. Sign up by **September 26** to volunteer to deliver boxes.

The mission of Maot Chitim of Greater Chicago, Inc. is to assist underserved members of the Greater Chicagoland Jewish community so that they may observe the Jewish holidays and daily life in a traditional and dignified manner. The mission is also to provide a *Tzedakah* (charity) vehicle to unite all members of the Jewish Community.
