She has been with the Foundation for many years, including roles as Director of the Graduate Fellowship Program and Vice President.

A native Minnesotan, Rabbi Abrahamson was ordained at HUC-JIR and has served as an Associate Rabbi and Co-Senior Rabbi at Mount Zion Temple in St. Paul, Minnesota. She has also led High Holy Days at Chicago Sinai Congregation in the past.

Rabbi Abrahamson is an engaging speaker and teacher, a popular scholar-in-residence, and has been recognized as one of the 50 most influential rabbis in North America by Newsweek. She is also a passionate student and teacher of Mussar and enjoys watching football, especially when the Vikings (or Buckeyes) are winning.

This month we will explore the Jewish tradition of storytelling! Together, we will delve into the history and significance of this tradition, uncovering how stories sustain us as individuals and as a community.



Thursday, February 27 | 6:00PM | In-person


